A NOTE FROM COMMANDER ELIAS VOULGARIS



Greetings,

First off thank you for the support and for the feedback I have been getting from many of you. While crime is down in the Roscoe Village area, your feeling of safety and security is my ultimate goal. To accomplish this I have implemented several initiatives:

1. Working with the Cook County State's Attorney's Community Justice Center, and with the Roscoe Village Chamber of Commerce, we have conducted "business walks" along Roscoe so that we can meet with you so you can express to us your concerns and issues.

We will continue conducting these "business walks."

- **2.** I recently started a Community Outreach Team which will soon be part of a Task Force with other city services, to deal with the homelessness issue in the District.
- **3.** Beat Integrity is to be maintained on Beat's 1921 and 1922, which includes Roscoe from Western to Southport. I want these Beat Officers to concentrate on their beats.

I continue to ask you to take steps to prevent certain types of crime:

Burglary – when someone breaks into your business:

- Shut and lock your windows and doors.
- Ensure there is adequate lighting in the front, back, sides of your business. Motion detectors are recommended.
- An alarm system is highly recommended. So is a camera system.
- Call police if you observe a suspicious person. Also call police if you observe any individual enter your business and asks questions such as: when do you close, do you just take cash, etc. If the person makes you feel uneasy, call the police and report it.

Shoplifters (not to be confused with a robbery) – when someone comes in and steals merchandise without force or without use/display of a weapon:

- Call 911 if anyone suspicious (person doesn't seem to be the type of customer your business caters to, etc) enters your business.
- Keep merchandise away from your doors and windows.
- If a person steals any of your merchandise, attempt to gather as much information as possible; especially their sex, race, height, weight and clothing.
- Maintain a "phone tree" with neighboring businesses which allows all of you to let each other know of suspicious individuals and/or activity.

Robbery – when someone takes your personal property by use of force or by using/displaying a weapon.

- If an individual comes into your business and threatens to harm you or displays a weapon, comply with his/her demands.
- Gather as much information as possible on the offender.
- When walking to/from your business do not display money bags; do not use your cell phones; do not use alleys, etc. When opening and closing, look around; if someone is watching you or acting suspiciously, walk to another location and call the police. Don't be a target!

FROM THE DESK OF LANE TECH PRINCIPAL, DR. CHRIS DIGNAM



Lane Tech High School had a busy summer and start to the school year.

Despite dealing with massive budget cuts, which caused a change in staffing and some programming, Lane received good news over the summer. We experienced the single greatest composite score growth in our schools 105 history, as well as the single greatest increase in

the composite score for ACT in Lane's academic history! Lane Tech's ACT composite score increased from 23.9 to 24.8, which includes all learners, general and special education. In addition to that growth, we also showed significant improvements in terms of AP expansion and student performance on our AP exams. Lane Tech administered 2,984 AP exams in May 2013 in 31 out of the of 33 AP courses offered by the College Board. Lane's Average AP score increased to 3.08, which means the average score was a passing score (a score of 3 or higher is considered passing by the College Board and provides college credit and/or placement by most universities). Lane Tech has 232 AP Scholars, 88 AP Scholars with Honors, 87 AP Scholars with Distinction, and 2 National AP Scholars. As a result of our AP growth, Lane Tech has been selected as one of 100 schools around North American to pilot the new AP Capstone program. AP Capstone is a new diploma program offered through the College Board which will award students with an AP Diploma if they achieve a 3 or higher on at least three AP exams and take two additional AP research courses. This new program will be rolled out next school year with approximately 60 students. We are excited for this opportunity as it is deemed especially prestigious to colleges and universities.

Finally, Lane made significant improvements with regard to our students' ISAT performance. Lane's reading exceed scores increased by 1.7 points, math exceed scores increased by 7.9 points, and science scores increased by 8 points.

Lane's 8th grade reading scores increased by 8.2 points. Our students' math scores exceed scores increased by 4.5 points (science scores are not measured). Additionally, our composite score grew by 1.4 points, which again, is commendable and all students meet or exceed standards.

Now that the school year is underway, we are having a tremendous year athletically. Our Varsity Boys' Soccer Team is currently ranked #2 in the state. Our Cross Country Team is also ranked in the top 10 in the state. Our Girls' Volleyball Team is having great success too, as well as our defending city championship swimming and diving team. Lane Tech's football team is having a great season, as well, and is hoping to advance even further into the state playoffs this year.

As a community member, you might be asking yourself how you can help your neighborhood school. We are always looking for volunteers. As our budget cuts dug pretty deep into our staffing, we have a need for regular volunteers in our various computer labs, college and career center, library, and other areas around the building. It's a great opportunity to work with our fabulous students and see all that Lane has to offer on the inside. Please contact the main office if you are able to help. If volunteering on-site is not available for you, we can always use monetary donations. Lane's website (www.lanetech.org and click on Donations) has several places you can give.
